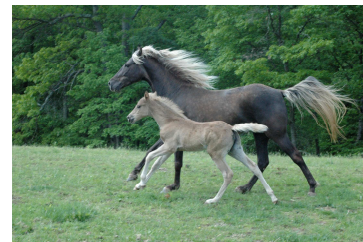

## 2010 World Equestrian Games

The Rocky Mountain Horse Association has been selected to perform a demonstration with our beautiful horses at the 2010 Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games. We selected eight chocolate horses with flaxen manes to do a musical quadrille, with a ninth horse as an alternate. A script describing the Rocky Mountain Horse with its attributes, disposition, gait and color will be read during the musical performance. At the completion of the quadrille, the script will also state that the Rocky Mountain Horse comes in a variety of colors, and we will have the different colored Rockies demonstrate the Rocky Mountain gait around the demonstration area. We have selected five horses to participate in this portion of the demonstration. The demonstration dates are September 25-28, 2010. The quadrille will consist of geldings and mares, the second portion of the demonstration horses are stallions as well as mares and geldings.

### **Election Procedures for the Rocky Mountain Horse Association**

#### **Excerpts from the By-Laws and the Rules of The Rocky Mountain Horse Association**

##### **BY-Laws**

##### **2.5.A. Voting Members**

Voting Members shall consist of Individual Members over the age of 18 years who are Members in Good Standing and who have completed their Provisional Membership Period.

##### **2.5.B. Nonvoting Members**

Nonvoting Members shall consist of: Junior Members; Individual Members who have not completed their Provisional Membership Period; any Member who is not a Member in Good Standing and Legal Entities. No minor member of a family who achieves adult status (greater than age 18) will be assigned a vote in RMHA matters as a portion of a family's vote.

##### **4.3 Elections**

##### **4.3.A General Procedures**

Elections shall be conducted in accordance with the Articles and these Bylaws by ballot mailed to each Member no later than May 1 of each year, which shall contain a space for write-in candidates. All position statements timely submitted by the candidates shall be included with the ballots. Returned ballots must be received by June 15 of that year. Winners shall be determined by that person or persons (qualified candidates) receiving the highest numbers of votes. A special run-off election shall be held only in the case of a tie vote. In the event of a run-off, the newly seated Board will function based on a quorum of those seated. If an Officer's position is in question due to a run-off, the Officer that held that specific position at the time of the election will continue in that capacity until the run-off election is completed and that seat on the Board is determined.

##### **4.3.B Voting**

No cumulative voting will be allowed. Each Member shall only be allowed one vote for each position to be filled. In the case of categories where more than one person is to be elected in that category, a ballot must contain one vote for each position to be filled in that category in order to be considered valid with respect to that category.

##### **RULES**

##### **7. Grace Period**

Any person holding an active membership in the preceding calendar year shall retain all membership privileges, except as they may be specifically limited by other sections of these rules, during the grace period for paying the current years dues. That grace period shall end March 31 of the current year. During this grace period a member shall have all rights and privileges to which they are entitled with the exception of those members as noted in the following paragraph 8. Those members who are serving a Provisional Period that began in the preceding year must pay their dues to attain full membership status regardless of when their Provisional Period was scheduled to end. However, they shall retain all rights of a Provisional member until March 31 of the current year.

I have worked at designing new advertisements to publicize "One Horse for all Occasions." Our latest advertisement is in the Discover Horses magazine which is the magazine exclusively at the Horse Park, as well as in the March issue of Trailblazer magazine.

Working with a group of European Horse owners we established a European Rocky Mountain Affiliated Club this past year.

The Board asked me to take over as committee chair of the International Show in 2009. My goal was to not lose money as we did the previous year. This was a success, and we didn't lose any money, we actually made \$365.00. This year's International Show was put in the hands of Ann Adkins. Ann and her committee are doing a great job. I know with all the events that will be going on besides the show everyone will have a great time.

With the economy as it is, we put together Regional Shows so that members did not have to travel so much to compete for points. Regional Shows are double point shows. Thanks to Dennie Begley and SAC we were able to put together this program.

We were lucky to have several good part time workers and we finally were able to have a really good full time employee; Sara Wilson. Sara works very closely with Juanita at the registry to ensure all paperwork is completed and all fees have been paid. Juanita works at the registry, and is a great asset to the RMHA. Sara also handles all the membership, and is responsible for documenting payments in QuickBooks.

Thanks to the foresight of previous Board members that put aside money to participate in the World Equestrian Games (WEG), we were able to change our location from the Trade Show area to the Equine Village saving over \$3,000, and placing us in the area with other equine organizations. As you know we will have a booth in that Equine Village to promote our horse. Through our reputation on the Horse Park we were able to secure spots in the schedule of horse demonstrations. We selected chocolate horses with flaxen mane and tail to participate in a musical quadrille. As few people have seen this color horse, it will be spectacular. We will also have a second demonstration with various color horses and we have been offered other demonstration times that may come open. I am really impressed that after only two practices the riders and horses are doing extremely well. Jan Culp will be taking over the coordination of the quadrille after I leave.

We still have more work to do. We are looking at getting all our records scanned to protect our registry. Long term goal is to have the registry located along with the Headquarters at the Kentucky Horse Park. We need to find more benefits for our members as this will add incentive for belonging to the RMHA. A professionally run association with Board members dedicated to the Rocky Mountain Horse is key. Everyone should know it is about the horse not personal agendas.

Lastly I have enjoyed working with and meeting a large number of the membership, and working with a great number of Board members. I will be around and will continue to help the RMHA.

## **From the Executive Directors “Tour of Duty”**

Some of you may not know that I have resigned my position as Executive Director of the Rocky Mountain Horse Association (RMHA) effective May 17, 2010. I have accepted the position as Executive Director of the Paso Fino Horse Association. The PFHA recently moved their headquarters from Florida to the Horse Park.

When I left the military, we had our briefings at the end of our tour. When I left the Chamber, I did an end of the year report. So I decided that as I am leaving the RMHA in the middle of the year, I would give the membership a year and a half review.

We have accomplished a great deal in the last year and a half. Without the support of many members on the Board and the membership we would never have accomplished all that we have. With support from the majority of the Board we were able to move our Headquarters to the center of the Equine World, The Kentucky Horse Park. This was a major project that Tom Thurman and other Board members were able to accomplish. We changed the way we do business with new membership and financial software. Thanks to Fay Raisanen who was able to take various types of financial data and transfer this data to QuickBooks. Thanks to my wife Karen, who spent many hours and weeks building the membership data base in QuickBooks. This was a major accomplishment to have all financials and membership in one data base. We were able to reduce our losses the year that I was hired by \$71,000. Our membership income has increased. We have been recognized by USEF as an Affiliate Associate which entitled us to have a home page link on the USEF Affiliate Website.

Within the first year, the Rocky Mountain Horse Association was well known at the Horse Park. I served on the Horse Parks Media Day Committee, which being on that committee gave us the opportunity to have a Rocky Mountain Horse in a demonstration viewed by over 50 media representatives from within and outside the state. That same year we were able to have a Rocky Mountain Horse in the Parade of Breeds. The Parade of Breeds was a demonstration performed twice a day for visitors of the Horse Park. Visitors remarked that they had never seen such a beautiful horse as our Rocky. We also had an advertisement in the Horse Park magazine that is distributed to visitors touring the Horse Park. Along with this we were able to have brochures in the brochure racks at the Horse Parks Visitors Center. We were able to reduce cost for membership meetings as we are tenants on the Horse Park and are able to hold Board meetings at the Pony Club free of cost.

I helped establish a monthly leadership luncheon for all the executives of the horse organizations located on the Horse Park. We sponsored one luncheon where we were able to tell everyone about our horse, and provided an opportunity for them to ride one of the beautiful horses that Rea Swan brought.

After Barb Beamer left the Board and the Chair of the Marketing Committee, the Board asked me to take over as Chairman of this committee. Barb did a great job and it was hard to follow in her footsteps. We were able to continue her record and put out some great magazines. The major horse magazines knew me from a previous position, and offered several advertising opportunities to have the Rocky Mountain Horse on the cover of the magazines. Our horse will soon be on the cover of Horsemen's Roundup magazine, along with a two page spread. Trailblazer magazine recently provided us with a nice article about our horse. We have brought back co-op advertising to help our members get publicity about their farms and we will continue that as the year goes by. We have continued to support Expos throughout the United States to publicize our horse. Paulette Klein and her crew did a great job at the Equine Affair in Ohio. We have even had our European members participate in Expos in Europe.

## Rated Trail Program

The Rated Trail course is designed in a natural trail environment fashioned to accommodate any level of rider and will allow sufficient time for course completion. There will be a minimum and maximum time for each ride. Each ride lasts 2-3 hours long.

The Rated Trail Director will send riders and horses to the trail at intervals so as not to create congestion. Riding in pairs or small groups is allowable, provided there is enough space between riders at the judged areas.

## Rockies WOW Crowds at Ohio Equine Affaire

This year, 10 members from the RMHA promoted the Rocky Mountain Horse® at the Ohio Equine Affaire with demonstrations, a stalled horse and a display booth. Paulette Klein and Tracy Berkey were co-project officers and coordinated the entire four-day exposition. “This event is a super way to show the world just how great is the Rocky from temperament to versatility to that great ambling lateral four-beat gait,” said Paulette. “It doesn’t get any better than this!”

With approximately a crowd of 500, 8 riders showed versatility in obstacles (ball, cones, tarp) during a 15-minute “Spotlight” segment on Thursday. On Friday, audience attendance filled the stands as eight riders and a buggy performed in another “Demonstration of the RMHA Breed”.

The following members and their horses from Kentucky participated: Annemarie Bryce from Smith’s Grove rode Stoney Point’s Lady hawk in Trail and Show Pleasure, Tracy Berkey of Southern Yankee Farm, Carlisle, rode S.F. Dazzlin’ Diamonte in Western Pleasure; Paulette Klein, Sylvandell Farms, Cynthiana, rode Rockin’ Killarney Rose in Show Pleasure for the Spotlight and as a Civil War Soldier in the Demo; Dennie Begley, Freedom Farm, East Bernstadt rode Cedar Hill Sam in the Spot and drove buggy in the Demo; Lisa Sidwell, Singlefoot Farm, Winchester, rode sidesaddle on her mare, Xena’s Dark Star. Gary Gwisdalla, as an old time Cowboy, rode Ramblin’ Rex and Nicki Gwisdalla on Moses Little Fay rode Western – both are from Ramblin’ Acres Farm in West Virginia. From Ohio, Jude Hall, Spydrweb Farm, Alexandria, rode Greenridge Snowblower “Smudge” as a competitive endurance rider and Vic Ayres, Rocky Ground Ranch, Piqua, glided Rebel Ridge Ellie through the gaits in Trail Pleasure.

We couldn’t have manned the booth, changed out horses, saddled, set up obstacles or conducted the entire affaire without the behind-the-scenes folks: Susie Rosengarten made 11 X 17 posters to dress up the booth; Julito Garcia helped tack, escort and hold horses; Darla and Carlee Schoffner, MacKensie Hager and Judy Shepherd helped at the booth and Jeff McCarty talked Rocky at the booth, escorted horse, helped tack the buggy and set up obstacles. It’s hard to do it all without the dedication and help of everyone.

After each demonstration, as well as throughout the entire four days, folks just swamped the booth wanting to know about the breed, purchasing Rocky apparel or just sharing their horse stories. Rocky owners and wanna-be owners just couldn’t seem to get enough of that special kind of horse – the Rocky Mountain!

**What's New for our 2010 International Horse Show**

We have a lot of different things going on this year. The show bill is finished, and the special awards will be at a different time this year.
