

2011 RMHA International Show Special Awards

All competitors must sign up for special awards in order for the show office to track their points. The deadline for adults is Wednesday by completion of the last class. For youth awards, the deadline is Friday morning before the first class begins. Forms are available in the show office.

For all Special Awards, points accumulate as follows (10 Point System):

1 st place= 10 points	6 th place= 5 points
2 nd place= 9 points	7 th place= 4 points
3 rd place= 8 points	8 th place= 3 points
4 th place= 7 points	9 th place= 2 points
5 th place= 6 points	10 th place= 1 point

Rea Swan Versatility Award

The Rea Swan Versatility Award is presented to the *horse* that exemplifies the virtues of the Rocky Mountain Horse: versatility, exceptional gait, smoothness, and easy going disposition.

- Each horse may compete in 7 of the following classes.
- Each horse must compete in and complete the Adult Trail Obstacle class* without being disqualified.
- The horses' top 5 scores will be counted using a 10 point scale.
- In the event of a tie, the horse with the highest score in the Adult Trail Obstacle class will be the winner.
- Horses shown in the SHOW PLEASURE classes are ineligible for this award.

Sam Tuttle Memorial Award

- The Sam Tuttle Memorial Award will be presented to the *horse* that achieves the highest total points in the following 7 classes ONLY.
- Points accumulate for the *horse* based on a 10 point scale.
- The horse must compete in and complete the Adult Trail Obstacle* class and not be disqualified.
- In the event of a tie, the horse with the highest score in the Adult Trail Obstacle class will be the winner.

Charles Kilburn Amateur Owned and Trained Versatility Award

- The Charles Kilburn Amateur Owned and Trained Versatility Award will be presented to the *horse/AOT rider team*.
- The highest total points in 5 of the following classes.
- Points accumulate only for the specific horse and the specific rider working together.
- Each team may compete in all of the following classes.
- Only two of the following under saddle classes will count toward the award.
- Each horse must also compete in and complete the Adult Trail Obstacle* class without being disqualified.
- Only the team's top 5 scores will be counted using a 10 point scale.
- In the event of a tie, the horse with the highest score in the Adult Trail Obstacle class will be the winner.

Only two of the following Amateur Owned and Trained Under Saddle classes may count toward the award:

Morgan Riggs Amateur Versatility Award

- The Morgan Riggs Amateur Versatility Award is presented to the *amateur rider* who achieves the highest total points in 5 of the following classes.
- One or more horses may be used.
- Only two of the following under saddle classes will count toward the award.
- Each amateur rider may compete in all classes listed below.
- Amateurs must also compete in and complete the Adult Trail Obstacle* class without being disqualified.
- Only the amateur rider's top 5 scores will be counted using a 10 point scale.
- In the event of a tie, the amateur rider with the highest score in the Adult Trail Obstacle class will be the winner.

- The Ashley Hytry Youth Versatility Award will be presented to the *horse/youth rider (youth aged 7-11) team* that achieves the highest total points in 4 of the following classes.
- Points accumulate only for the specific horse and the specific rider working together.
- Each team may compete in all 5 of the following classes.
- Only the team's top 4 scores will be counted using a 10 point scale.

Sara Gwisdalla Youth Versatility Award (Youth Ages 12-17)

- The Sara Gwisdalla Youth Versatility Award will be presented to the *horse/youth rider (youth aged 12-17) team* that achieves the highest total points in 5 of the following classes.
- Points accumulate only for the specific horse and the specific rider working together.
- Each team may compete in all 6 classes.
- Each team must also compete in and complete the Youth Trail Obstacle* class without being disqualified.
- Only the team's top 5 scores will be counted using a 10 point scale.
- In the event of a tie, the horse with the highest score in the Youth Trail Obstacle class will be the winner.
